

OPEN CLASS GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. GENERAL INFORMATION:

The following general rules and regulations apply to the Open Class Departments. Additional rules specific to the individual departments are found in the respective entry sections. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to be familiar with these rules and regulations.

2. INTERPRETATION OF RULES:

The Douglas County Fair reserves the right to interpret and amend the **Open Class General Rules & Regulations** and resolve differences relating to them as necessary.

3. COMPLIANCE:

The exhibitor agrees to comply with all rules and regulations governing the Douglas County Fair upon entering exhibits in the Fair.

This includes compliance with the current **Open Class General Rules & Regulations** and additional rules specific to the individual Open Class Departments. Exhibitors must also agree to cooperate with all Douglas County Fair officials and personnel in all matters of policy.

Exhibitors serve an important part of the Fair in celebrating and showcasing Douglas County's excellence. Our primary audience consists of family and youth. The Douglas County Fair reserves the right and has the sole discretion to reject any exhibit that contains graphic or obscene material or is otherwise objectionable to the Fair's family-oriented target audience. In such cases, the exhibit will be disqualified and removed. Failure to comply with removal will subject exhibitor to penalties as Douglas County Fair may order and/or prescribed by law.

4. LIABILITY:

Management Liability: The Douglas County Fair management is not responsible for personal injury and assumes no liability for loss or damage by theft or disasters (human or natural) to any property of the exhibitor while on the fair grounds.

Exhibitor Liability: The exhibitor is solely responsible for any consequential injury or loss resulting from an article exhibited by the exhibitor and must assume responsibility relating to all legal or other proceedings regarding the exhibit or any damage or injury to any other person or property caused by the exhibitor or exhibits at the Fair.

5. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

All entries must be submitted either through the online website or using an official Douglas County Fair Entry Form. Entry forms may be obtained from the County Fair website, www.douglascountyfair.org, or the County Fair office. Any fee or money due must accompany the submission. No item can be entered unless there is a suitable class in the appropriate Fair entry book.

Should an entry be made in a name other than that of a bona fide owner or using erroneous information regarding the item, the entry will be disqualified from competition and the exhibitor barred from participation until reinstated.

The opportunity to exhibit at the Douglas County Fair is open to all persons without regard to race, creed, color, sex, age or other non-merit factors. Discrimination is prohibited.

6. ENTRY DEADLINE:

All Open Class livestock pre-entries are due to the Douglas County Fair office on July 11th All other Open Class entries will be accepted until 7:00 PM on Tuesday, July 9, 2019.

7. RECEIVING OF EXHIBITS:

All static Open Class exhibits must be dropped off at Village Pointe in the Exhibit Hall, the old Beauty Brands by Bentley, on Tuesday, July 9, 2019 between the 1:00 pm to 7:00 PM. All Open Class livestock entries must arrive at the date and time designated in the additional rules specific to individual Departments.

8. JUDGES/JUDGING:

A judge is not permitted to be an exhibitor in a class they are judging.

Any person who interferes with the judging process will be asked to leave the judging area. Further action will be at the discretion of the Superintendent and Fair Management.

An exhbit entered in the incorrect class may be transferred to the appropriate class at the discretion of the Department Superintendent and Fair Management prior to the start of judging. However, if the correct class for the entry has already been judged the class will not be reopened and the exhibit will not be judged.

9. AWARDS:

The judge may, but is not required to, award all the ribbons offered in a class. It is the intention of Fair Management that no premium or distinction of any kind be given to any exhibit deemed unworthy by the judge.

The Premium Schedule is as follows:

- Best of Show Purple Rosette \$10 Premium
- Best of Douglas County Purple Rosette \$10 Premium
- Best of Division Lavender Rosette \$8 Premium
- 1st Place Blue Ribbon \$5 Premium
- 2nd Place Red Ribbon \$4 Premium
- 3rd Place White Ribbon \$3 Premium
- 4th Place Yellow Ribbon \$2 Premium
- 5th Place Green Ribbon \$1 Premium
- Participation Orange Ribbon

Payment of Douglas County Fair premiums will be mailed to exhibitors after July 22, 2019. The Douglas County Fair will not be held liable for any award or premium offered by a private or business donor separate from the Douglas County Fair should that donor fail to provide the offered award or premium.

10. DISPUTES AND PROTESTS:

The Douglas County Fair Management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these Rules & Regulations and to arbitrarily settle disputes and questions of differences. Any protest based on the statement that the judge(s) was incompetent will not be considered. If a protest on any other grounds is not resolved with the Department Superintendent, the Exhibitor may present a protest in written form to the Fair Management within 24 hours of ribbons being displayed.

11. RELEASE TIME:

Removal of entries by the exhibitor prior to release time set by the Douglas County Fair is prohibited. Premiums will be forfeited. All Open Class exhibits except livestock will be released from $4:00 \, \text{PM} - 6:00 \, \text{PM}$ on Sunday, July 14, 2019 ONLY.



12. RETURNED CHECKS:

There will be a \$40 service charge for any non-sufficient fund check. If the exhibitor does not make payment of the check and service charge within five (5) days, the exhibitor will not receive any premium for entries.

13. **SOLICITATION:**

Exhibitors in the Open Class Departments are not allowed to solicit Fair Guests.

14. LOTTERIES:

No lottery or raffle shall be conducted at the Douglas County Fair without the written authority of Douglas County Fair Management.

15. **SMOKING:**

Smoking is prohibited in all buildings.

16. ALCOHOL ABUSE:

The State of Nebraska Rules of Alcohol Use and Abuse are enforced on any property where the Douglas County Fair has a presence.

17. FIRE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

By order of the State Fire Marshal, the use of flammable and combustible materials inside any buildings is strictly prohibited.

18. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS:

The Douglas County Fair reserves the right to cancel events or change scheduling if deemed necessary.

Department Specific Rules:

BREAD: Bread must be one loaf, baked in a single bread pan, size 4"x8" or larger for white and whole wheat. Quick Bread sizes should be 3"x7" or larger. Pan or loaf size is optional for other kinds of bread. Rolls must be shown in groups of four attached, made in an 8x8 or 9x9 inch pan. All bread should be shown on a white paper plate or piece of cardboard that had been covered with white paper. Bread products must be secured in a plastic bag. Muffins, kolaches, etc. 4 on a plate in a plastic bag.

CAKES: May be exhibited on white paper plates, or cardboard covered with white paper. Must be frosted, unless otherwise specified. One slice of the cake from those placing will be used for display purposes. No cake mixes are allowed in any category except for Create-A-Cake and Decorated Cake.

CANNED FRUITS & VEGETABLES: All products entered in this class shall be canned from August 2018 through July 2019. The entry must be in quart or pint jars used for canning. PLEASE LEAVE JAR RINGS ON ALL JARS. All canned goods must remain in good condition during fair. Any article receiving a premium that does not comply with the above, loses the right to such premium. We require all classes be processed according to USDA guidelines. Jars must be labeled with (1) method of preservation, (2) altitude, (3) processing time, and (4) number of pressure if pressure canner used.

COOKIES: Four cookies on a white paper plate, secured in a plastic bag.

DRIED/DEHYDRATED: Involves drying out the natural moisture present in all fruit, vegetables, etc. so that the enzymes which cause decay are inhibited. Exhibit in an unsealed pint or half-pint jar ONLY. Jar must be full. Please include lid and ring.

HOMEMADE CANDY: Six pieces of candy on a small white paper plate secured with a plastic bag.

JAMS, JELLIES, & BUTTER: All products entered in these divisions shall be canned from August 2018 through July 2019.

Must be in jelly or half pint jars used for canning. PLEASE LEAVE JAR RINGS ON ALL JARS. Entries will be opened and judged on appearance, flavor and texture. WE REQUIRE ALL CLASSES BE PROCESSED ACCORDING TO USDA GUIDELINES.

- Jams Jams are crushed pieces of fruit suspended in its own jelly. All products entered in this class shall be canned from August 2018 - July 2019.
- Jellies Jellies are beautiful in color, translucent, tender enough to cut easily with a spoon, yet firm enough to hold its

- 3. Judges reserve the right to reclassify any entry or remove those they deem in poor taste.
- 4. Real or dummy cakes may be used. Anyone using a dummy cake must be able to reproduce it in a real cake.
- 5. Each cake must be solely the work of the entrant except Divisions 1, 2, and 3 where the cake may be baked by an adult. When you win two trophies in any division, either in the present show or future shows, you must move to the next higher division.
- 6. The entry fee is \$10.00 per adult and \$5.00 per person under the age of 18, with no limit on the number of items each person may enter. There are no refunds.
- 7. Each person entered will be eligible for various prizes drawn for and given out at the awards ceremony.
- 8. Judging will be done on the point system as follows:
 - Degree of Difficulty: 0-10
 - Artistic achievement: 0-10
 - Work Involved: 0-10
 - Originality: 0-10
 - Special Features: 0-4
- 9. At the judge's discretion, additional points may be awarded for outstanding displays of confectionery workmanship. 





- Breeding and Market Does are REQUIRED to have a scrapie tag in their ear.
- Animals CANNOT be shown in both breeding and market divisions.

AGE: Goats are to have milk teeth and there shall be no evidence of breaking to the skin or eruption of the two permanent front teeth.

HAIR: Market goats must be uniformly slick shorn with 3/8 inch of hair or less from the knee and up at the time of arrival on the fairgrounds. Hair may be left on the legs up to the knees and hocks only.

NECK CHAINS: Goats are to be shown with neck chains or smooth collars only.

SHOWING and HANDLING PRACTICES: The use of showing and/or handling practices that may be considered objectionable or abusive, such as striking or slapping goats may result in the lowering of a ribbon placing. Exhibiting the goat for bracing position is acceptable.

MARKET SHOW CLASS & GENDER: Market goats may be doe or wethers (No billies). All market goats will be weighed and divided into classes based on total numbers and weight range. Does and wethers will show together. NO WEIGHT LIMIT.

BREEDING & MARKET GOAT: All breeding does will be mouthed for age. All doe kids must have all lamb or temporary teeth present; yearling does can have yearling teeth but cannot have two-year old teeth up. Does exhibiting two-year old teeth will be allowed to show but will not be eligible to compete for championship. Classes may be divided at discretion of Show Management.

Breeding Does must be ear tagged or tattooed — registered does must be registered with the breed association by entry date and have the flock tag, or tattoo and registration tag (if required by breed association). Flock tag number must be on the registered paper, and on the ID affidavit and be in the animal's ear at check-in. Both commercial and registered does must also have an official USDA (scrapie) identification tag.

FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Refer to the GENERAL & ANIMAL RULES AND REGULATIONS. REQUIRED to have a scrapie tag in their ear.

ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION: An exhibitor must exhibit breeding sheep and market lambs that have been tagged and identified under their name. The ID's for all sheep entries will be checked by superintendent when the animal is brought to the Fair. Final decision as to the class in which an animal will be shown will rest with the superintendent.

ENTRY LIMIT: An exhibitor is limited to exhibiting a TOTAL of FIVE sheep.

Animals **CANNOT** be shown in both breeding and market divisions.

WEIGH IN: Weight of the sheep will be final once it leaves the weigh-in area.

HEALTH INFORMATION:

- Animals that have active ringworm, fungus or visible warts will not be allowed entry into the Douglas County
 Fair. If animals are brought and found to be suspect, it is at the Show Superintendent's and Fair Official's
 discretion to seek advisement from a veterinarian as to possible dismissal of infected animals from the fair
 and show.
- All sheep must be 5 days or less fresh slick shorn before entry and weigh in at the fair.

- No shearing of Sheep is allowed onsite.




